Launched in 2019 this is an ideal championship to start your racing career.

The Cl's 1 litre power unit may not make them the fastest race cars on a Scottish Championship race weekend, but racing door handle to door handle will bring a smile to any racer's face - whether you're a seasoned campaigner or a complete newcomer. There is also a Newcomers cup for novices, and every championship run so far has been keenly contested. The defending champion is Sam Corson. This championship for the Citroen C1 hatchback has seen keen battles throughout the field at every race. The C1 Cup is led at half way by Murray Scott, who started racing C1s last season. He won the first 3 races and has led the title chase from round 1. He is chased by two drivers who are under 20 points behind him. Ayden Wilson last year's top Rookie. He started with a 3rd in round 1 and since then has taken three 2nd places, and a win in round 5. Just 2 points behind him is 2023 runner up Dan Martin, He had a 2nd then 3rd in the first two rounds, so he and Ayden were tying the points table after 2 races. Dan then had a 5th but bounced back to win rounds 4 and 6. James Hitchen is 4th but could catch the top 3 with a good run. In the Newcomers Cup, Murray Scott has dominated the early rounds. Dale Edwards has his top scores as three 2nds in class so far, and could close the gap with a few class wins.

Gerry Hendry is dominating the ST Cup this year, after finishing 3rd last year. He has won 5 of the 6 races run, and came second in round 5. Last year he also started well leading the Cup early on.

He is well ahead of Kieren Preedy, who has scored well with two 2nds, two 3rds and a 4th in his 6 scores. Third overall is Andrew Mackie, but he has veteran and former champion Dave Colville close behind. Steven Gray the 2021 Champion has only scored in 2 rounds so far, but had a win and a 3rd.

The Challenge spec cars, are led by Lorn Murray, they are slightly lower spec but go well. He has Sophie Kinghorn just 5 points behind him. New for this year is a Newcomers' Cup, for drivers in their first 2 years of car racing. There are 7 drivers registered and it's really close. Tied for the lead are James Dickie and Sophie Kinghorn. Both are class winners, with James taking 4 wins to Sophie's two. But she has four 2nds as well. Kenneth Lees is 3rd and has 4 podium finishes in his scores, so he will be keen to get that class win.

The Scottish Mini Cooper Cup has always been very competitive and 2024 has been the same. The cars race 3 times at each Scottish meeting at Knockhill. The first two races are with the more powerful Cooper S cars, but their third race of the day is only for Cooper cars. The final Cooper race also features a reversed grid for the top 5 to 8 finishers in the previous race.

There have been 12 races so far this year. Defending champion Oly Mortimer leads the title race by 22 points. He has scored 5 wins, one 2nd, one 3rd as his top scores, but also has a no score and a 14th. In second so far is Ian Munro, he has three 2nds and a 3rd, in his scores. He's the only driver to score in every round. In 3rd is Robbie Dalgleish, a former champion who has completed 9 races. He has three 1st, a 2nd, two 3rds as his top scores. He's 26 points behind Oly. In 4th equal overall mid season are Jason Ballantyne. and Daniel Paterson, both are race winners.

Top Newcomer Martin Wijetunga is 8th overall, having taken a 5th and 6th as as his top scores. There have been 5 race winners this year so far. Mini Cooper racing is always close, and anything can happen. There is plenty of racing still to be done, so the winner at any race could come from the top 7 or 8 drivers.

In the Newcomers Cup, Martin Wijetunga is leading the 9 registered competitors by 50 points. Ross Forster was 3rd last year and is chasing hard, but needs some more class wins. He has Jacob Heap only 4 points back. Both have taken a class win this year. Four other drivers have class wins as well, so there's plenty of competition in the newcomers.

Mini Cooper S R53 cars, are the most powerful cars in Scottish one make saloon racing. They run on slick racing tyres, but may use racing wet tyres if the they choose. These cars have 1.6 litre supercharged engines and adjustable suspension. They had 12 rounds with all scores counting. They start with the Cooper Cup cars in the first 2 of every 3 Knockhill Mini races, at a race meeting. This weekend they will compete in both races. Their extra power will see them slowly leave the Cooper Cup Cars to their own battle.

Defending Cooper S champion Jamie Blake has had good competition from Rich Flett, in this years championship. With guest competitor Ross Wilkinson joining the grid for Anglesey, while our regular competitors should make the trip south to Anglesey.

Last year Jamie Blake beat his brother Craig to the title, with Rich Flett 3rd. Like all SMRC championships, guests are welcome, but do not score points.

SCOTTISH CLASSIC SPORTS & SALOONS CHAMPIONSHIP

There are several classes available, with Saloons and Sportscars racing each other. Cars that were manufactured before 31st December 1989 are eligible, and must remain predominantly in period specification.

Competitors race against each other, but only score points against drivers in their own class. The scores are then put into the overall points table, to find the champion. There are 22 registered competitors. Competitors need 3 drivers to start a class in order to score full points, if 2 or fewer start then points are reduced. It's the smallest engine class A that sees the overall leader, Ian Mitchell with his Vauxhall Nova. But he's chased hard by last years' runner up Andrew Mitchell in the race winning Triumph TR8. In 3rd Michael Longstaffe is another class A racer, driving his MG Midget. Craig Houston has scored well and is 4th overall with the Lotus Eclat. Look out for Adam Kinmond, his Rover SD1 is rapid.

In the XR2 class, Duncan O'Neill is the defending champion. But this year Paul Green has taken 6 class wins and is 40 points ahead, in the title race.

CLASSA

These races are rounds three and four of an eight round championship for 2024. The Cockshoot Cup is a silver trophy presented to the North West Centre of the MG Car Club by Joseph Cockshoot in 1934.

They were the main distributor and retailer of MG cars in the pre and post war years for Manchester and North West England. The Championship started in 1984 so this year it is celebrating forty continuous years. The champion for the last two years was David Morrison driving his MG Midget and he will be competing today to try to win a hat trick. David has changed class and will be in the race tyre Class C with stiff competition from the likes of Keith Egar who has a Midget with an MGF engine, Chris Greenbank in another MGF and Karl Green in a newly restored MGF Cup car. Class F for standard MGFs is always very close. The more modern front wheel drive ZRs and ZSs are now together in Class A with the older MGBs and Midgets in Class B. The remaining rounds are at Oulton Park on September 7th and on the Silverstone National Circuit on September 29th.

DDMC NORTHERN SALOON & SPORTSCARS

The Northern Saloon & Sports Car Championship has just past the halfway point in the 2024 season.

The current leader is Dan Kell (Ford Sierra XR4x4) he is followed by Scott Hubel (Peugeot 205T16R), and 2023 champion Stephen Reece (Lotus Elise) they are separated by only 2 points. The championship has points awarded 20,18,16 etc and these are topped up by starter points. We award up to a maximum of 3 extra points depending on starters in class.

The grid is very mixed, with Caterhams, Honda Civics, VW, Mazda 5 and a variety of kit cars all vying for position in their appropriate class. The championship has been running for over 25 years and we visit a variety of circuits each year. This year so far, we have been to Snetterton, Croft and Knockhill, Donington. This weekend Anglesey, and then return visits to Croft for the DDMC organised Battle of Britain meeting and finishing off at Knockhill in September. These cars may resemble SEAT Leon road cars, but are factorybuilt purpose made Touring Cars. The driver sits low and well back, the cars are left hand drive and produce almost 350bhp, operated through a paddle shift DSG gearbox and running on Hankook slick racing tyres.

Anglesey will be the second visit for SEATs to the UK Mainland following their earlier visit to Donington Park in May. Amazingly, with 8 rounds completed there has been 6 different race winners with Dave Maguire and Stephen Wright both taking the chequered flag on two occasions. But it is Eddie Peterson who is proving the driver to catch with a win and three second places and three fastest laps to his name. The top 3 championship contenders having to qualify with lower powered ECUs and then the top 3 qualifiers must race with these lower powered ECUs in Race 1. For Race 2, it's a level playing field as all cars run the same ECU power, but the top 8 finishing positions are reversed from race 1.

PRECISION GRAPHICS IRISH TOURING CAR CHAMPIONSHIP

The ITCC has produced some of the closest and best saloon car action ever seen at Mondello Park. The Championship runs in two distinct classes based on power to weight ratio. Vehicles over 280bhp/tonne run in the Super Touring, with the lesser powered vehicles running in the Touring class.

Cian Walsh heads the classification for Super Touring despite a double DNF at Bishopscourt which saw him drop 36 points behind then championship leader, and 2023 Champion, Rob Savage. A blistering run of 4 wins, 4 poles and 4 fastest laps has seen him power into the championship lead. With just 18 points separating the top 3,a good performance here this weekend will see contenders head to the final round at Mondello on 14/15 September.

In the Touring class, Ian Stryker has built himself a quick Honda Integra K20 DC2 and despite a huge performance disadvantage to the Super Touring class he has been close to them. Behind him Ryan Stryker is Mr Consistency with just one DNF. Back in third place, David Flynn has completed just 4 rounds and won all four with plenty of fastest laps.

The Mondello Park organised Fiesta Zetec Championship regularly fields **COMPETITORS** sold out grids and is a testimony to the tightly controlled regulations, competitive racing and friendly paddock.

The championship is for 1250cc, Zetec engined, 3 or 5 door hatchback models, built between 1996 and 2002. Cars in the championship are near standard and must conform to a tightly controlled set of regulations and run on a specified Nankangtyre. At the halfway point of the season, Sean McGovern leads the championship courtesy of two race wins, a pair of second places with additional points being earned for fastest laps and a pole position. Consistency is the key in this championship, as second place William Kellett proves with four podiums in the first six races. In third place is 2023 Championship runner up David Maguire tied on points with 2023 Rookie Champion, Jason O'Connell. With a win apiece it demonstrates the close competitive racing through the championship. Renowned for introducing so many new competitors into circuit racing, 2024 has so far seen 10 competitors make their racing debut. Deserving of their own championship, 2023 Junior rallycross Champion, Tony McGuire heads the field with 3 wins, but was thwarted last time out by newcomer Marc Mulhern who scored a double win on his debut. Expect nose to tail racing right through the field!
